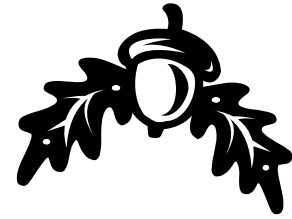

Letter from the Club President

Dear Editor,

Despite being an old git this is only the second time I have written a "To the Editor", (at any publication!) and is something I meant to do long ago following the 2006 AGM. Colin Billings made mention of the comments I made at the AGM, perhaps it is worth expanding on these a little.

Sevenoaks & District Motor Club has always had a heritage of being a "doing club" and one that had strength in depth by organising a wide range of events and having a good number of competitors. Some clubs are known as "rally clubs", some as "race clubs", etc. SDMC has always been known as an active club that offers its members a wide range of activities. Long may that be so.

It is many years since I did a spell as chairman; it was a period when I was supported by colleagues who had the same long-term vision as I did. There is no doubt that SDMC is a members' club and not a commercial business, despite the fact that we always had the philosophy of turning a modest profit on whatever we did. I was once advised that minimising costs was the easiest way of making money, sound advice and something to be remembered. There was a reason for this for we held the long-term vision of gathering the wherewithal to establish a competition venue for the members use. Not a social venue, but a competition venue.

We tend to take it for granted that there are a number of permanent venues available to motorsport. How did these permanent venues come about? In many cases because a club had a vision, worked away, established a sound financial base and took advantage of and created opportunities. As examples Bugatti Owners Club, a very long time ago saw the potential of what is now known as Prescott Hill Climb, initially did a lease rental deal and then purchased the property. The same happened with MAC at Shelsley, although in this case they strictly speaking do not have ownership, but do have a 100 year lease. There are many other examples.

Venues are not easy, they never have been and it was no easier back in the thirties when Prescott came to life. If the vision and desire is there, I am convinced it is still possible. I'm in the fortunate position of knowing what goes on countrywide and there are clubs that are finding and developing venues. Not many, but it happens and some will have a long-term future. Planning issues can be difficult, always was so but remember agriculture is changing with all farmers looking to diversify so in some ways there may be more opportunities now than there were in years gone by.

Such a vision is, I think, worth working on. To achieve it means creating the financial backbone to support it. SDMC has once again got reasonable resources, resources to be used wisely. The late Mark Dawson clearly had the same thoughts as is shown by the financial legacy he gave the Club and the effort he made in what turned out to be the last few months of his life investigating all sorts of venue possibilities.

It would be great to see Mark's vision a reality. Let's make sure SDMC is not "just another club" but is a vibrant, active club organising good events that stand out above others, events that are not only enjoyed but are also building for the future. Let's keep building that financial backbone, seeking out realistic possibilities, making sure the head rules the heart and that SDMC leads the way into the future.

Marshals' Training Dates for 2007

As you may be aware for any marshal wishing to volunteer for the Rally Wales GB in 2007 there is an MSA/Event requirement that they are part of their National Marshals Register, which the Introduction To Rally Marshalling course can provide the necessary training to support their application. Similarly for existing MSA registered marshals there is an ongoing requirement for them to attend a Marshals Training Day, particularly if they wish to upgrade. Again the other Rally Marshals courses provide the necessary training.

To this end you may be interested in the following dates for Marshals Training courses.

As always this training is provided free of charge by MSA Marshals Instructors, the only costs to attendees being their fuel, plus either the college refectory or local café prices for breakfast and lunch, if people don't wish to take their own sandwiches, etc.

Sadly, a couple of days before Christmas, Neil finally succumbed to the cancer which had been part of his life for the last five years or so, since he was initially diagnosed with suffering from this dreadful condition. Many would not have known that in these last five years Neil knew he was on borrowed time. After an initial brief period of anger he very much had the attitude that he was going to enjoy whatever time was available to him, time that was a bonus. This didn't mean he went rushing off on trips abroad etc., yes he did a bit of that, but he also continued to work away in B19, being responsible not only for many good things in B19 but also for many good things within the spectre of "Motor Sport South East".

Our friendship stretched back well over 30 and getting on for 40 years. Both guys not renowned for "nibbling around the edges" but for being pretty upfront and "saying how it is". We had a lot of fun, we helped each other, we abused each other. That was the way it was, had one not hurled some piece of abuse or insult at the other undoubtedly worry would have set in. It is trite to suggest we'll miss the abuse, truth is that we will and the many other facets that were Neil Benfield.

Neil gave much to motor sport, but then he would suggest motor sport gave him much too. Motor sport has lost a true friend.

Our thoughts and condolences stretch out to Rosie and Gemma at this sad time.

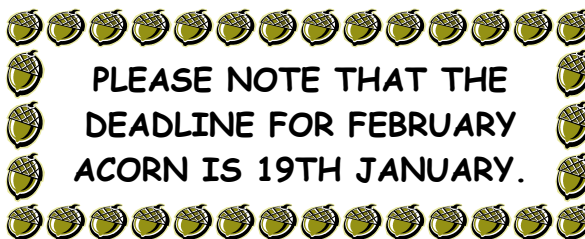
